

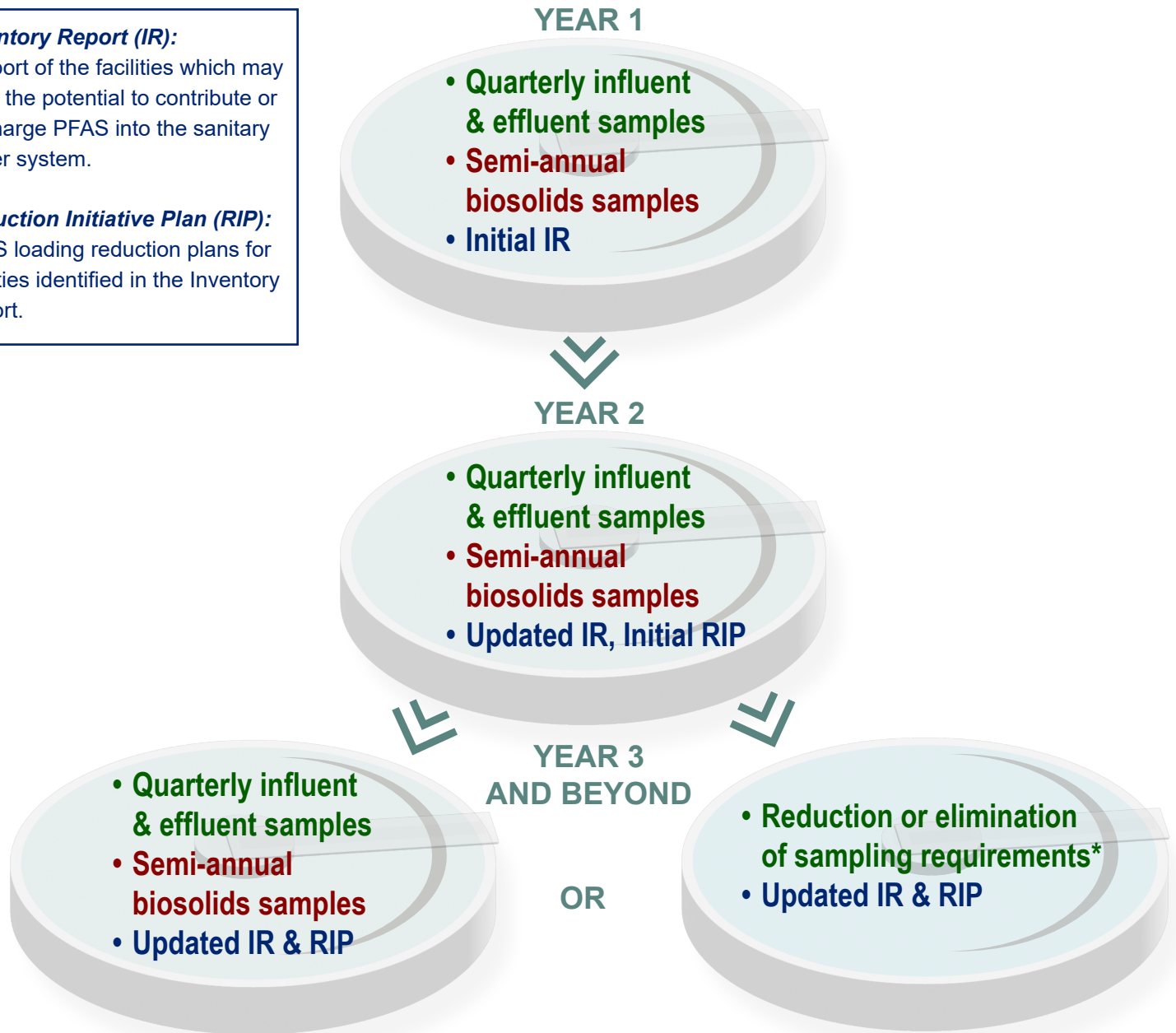
The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) has recently begun issuing draft NPDES permits to municipalities with the addition of Special Conditions involving PFAS sampling and reporting. This infographic and the attached whitepaper provide a summary of the new PFAS Special Conditions for wastewater treatment facilities in Illinois with a design average flow above 1 MGD.

Inventory Report (IR):

A report of the facilities which may have the potential to contribute or discharge PFAS into the sanitary sewer system.

Reduction Initiative Plan (RIP):

PFAS loading reduction plans for facilities identified in the Inventory Report.



*Following official NPDES permit modification approval by IEPA

At present, the IEPA is exclusively issuing this set of PFAS Special Conditions to major wastewater treatment plants with a design average flow above 1 MGD. The IEPA does not anticipate including this set of PFAS conditions in the NPDES permits for facilities discharging less than 1 MGD. Currently, there is no PFAS discharge standard/limit for wastewater treatment facilities.
